Worksite Conduct Procedures

- 1) Solicitation laws in USPS/FED solicitation is allowed to commercial or nonprofit activities performed under contract with the postal service or pursuant to the provisions of the Randolph-Sheppard Act (The Randolph-Sheppard Act, 20 USC & 107 et seq., is a federal law which mandates a priority to blind persons to operate vending facilities on federal property.)
- 2) Depositing Literature depositing or posting of handbills, flyers, pamphlets, signs, posters, place cards, or other literature (except official postal service/ Fed and other governmental notices and announcements) on the grounds, walk ways, driveways, parking and maneuvering areas, exteriors of buildings, and other structures, or on the floors, walls, stairs, racks counters, desks, writing tables, window ledges, or furnishing in interior public areas on postal services & federal premises is prohibited.
 This does not apply to the following: Posting Notices on employee bulletin boards as authorized by 39 CFR 243.2 (Management Labor Organization agreements under union endorsement or contracted benefits)
- 3) Identification and Contract entry or access to USPS/Federal Government facilities require proper identification and business cards that must be on you at all times when confronted. This is a US Gov't security measure policy that has been strongly enforced since September 11th. You must have a name or contact person that's a manager or supervisor familiar with your visit to escort you into the breakroom area. The violation of these guidelines is a violation of laws against trespassing.
- 4) Work Room Floor for safety measures the Postal Service/ Fed Gov't requires you to stay within the breakroom or cafeteria at all times while inside a facility unless when needing to go to the rest room, time clock or deck. If you desire to approach an employee or get their attention try motioning them with a flier to come to you. Otherwise notify the supervisor from your initial entry for permission.
- 5) Alcoholic Beverages, Drugs and Smoking anyone under the influence of alcohol or any drug that has been defined as a "controlled substance" may not enter Postal Services or Federal Property. This is prohibited and is defined in Title 21, United States Code Section 802. This includes all forms of marijuana. Cigarette smoking is prohibited in all Postal Service and Federal Buildings or office space including public lobbies.
